Re: New Location of the County Municipal Complex

KENTVILLE, NOVA SCOTIA – The Town of Kentville has offered its support to the Municipality of the County of Kings in locating their new municipal complex within Town limits.

“We are pleased with the consultation process that Kings County has embarked on for the new Municipal Complex,” stated Mayor Sandra Snow about the County’s search for a location of their new complex. “Be assured that the decisions achieved through this process will be fully supported by this council.”

At the Council Advisory Committee meeting on Monday April 10th, council voted unanimously to send a letter to Kings County confirming their interest in keeping the new municipal building in Kentville.

“Their staff have conducted their business in our downtown for over five decades, and with easy access to parks and trails and services that keep balance in their work and life,” stated Mayor Snow. “As the centre for regional service delivery, their staff and citizens have access to public transportation to reach the municipal complex.”

“It is an opportunity to embrace the Kings 2050 Plan as well as the One Nova Scotia Plan by locating the new municipal complex in Kentville,” stated Mayor Sandra Snow. “The Town of Kentville has several parcels of land that are shovel ready, including the former KCA site, the downtown Robinson Building site and other privately owned properties.”
